## Third Quarter 2011 ACCRA Cost of Living Index

Released October 2011

The third quarter 2011 ACCRA Cost of Living Index report is now available from C2ER – The Council for Community and Economic Research. The most expensive of the 309 urban areas participating in the third quarter pricing event was New York (Manhattan), N.Y., with a Cost of Living Index value of 223.9, more than twice the national average of 100. The least expensive urban area was Harlingen, Texas, with an index value of 81.7. Wichita's Cost of Living Index third guarter was 91.8.

The composite index is based on six component categories – housing, utilities, grocery items, transportation, health care and miscellaneous goods and services. In a recent press release, C2ER featured communities with the most and least expensive food costs as measured by 26 items from a variety of categories that comprise the grocery item component of the index. That data is shown in the table below.

Wichita's index number for grocery items was 89.3, nearly 11 percent below the national average.

Because the price of coffee had wide regional variations third quarter, C2ER highlighted this grocery item in its current press release. Below are the five most expensive and least expensive places to buy coffee among the 309 participating urban areas.
