




Forecast Review (Spring 2019)



- Kansas is expected to continue to grow in 2019.
- Rural areas are likely to see mixed growth opportunities, with net zero growth for the state as a whole.
- Food manufacturing is expected to see continued growth, as long as the nation continues to expand.
- Manufacturing will likely grow, but adding only a few jobs in 2019.
- Retail sales remains a mystery and growth is unlikely.











Kansas Exports 2018
















US Economic Train Continues Down the Track
